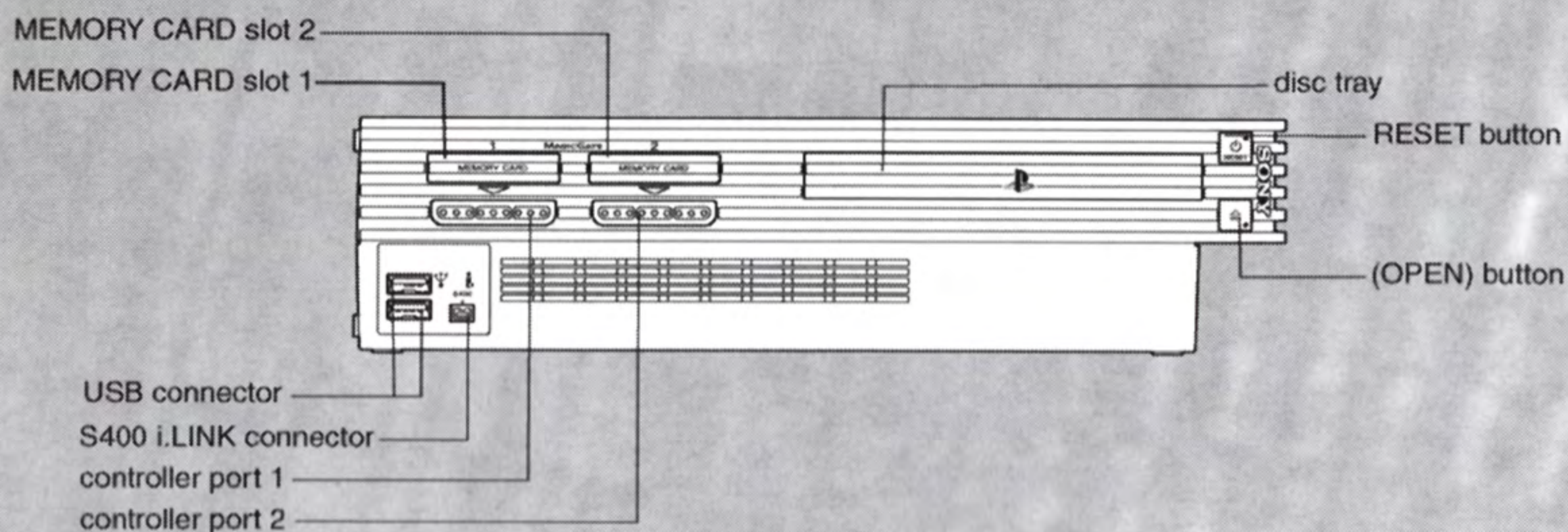

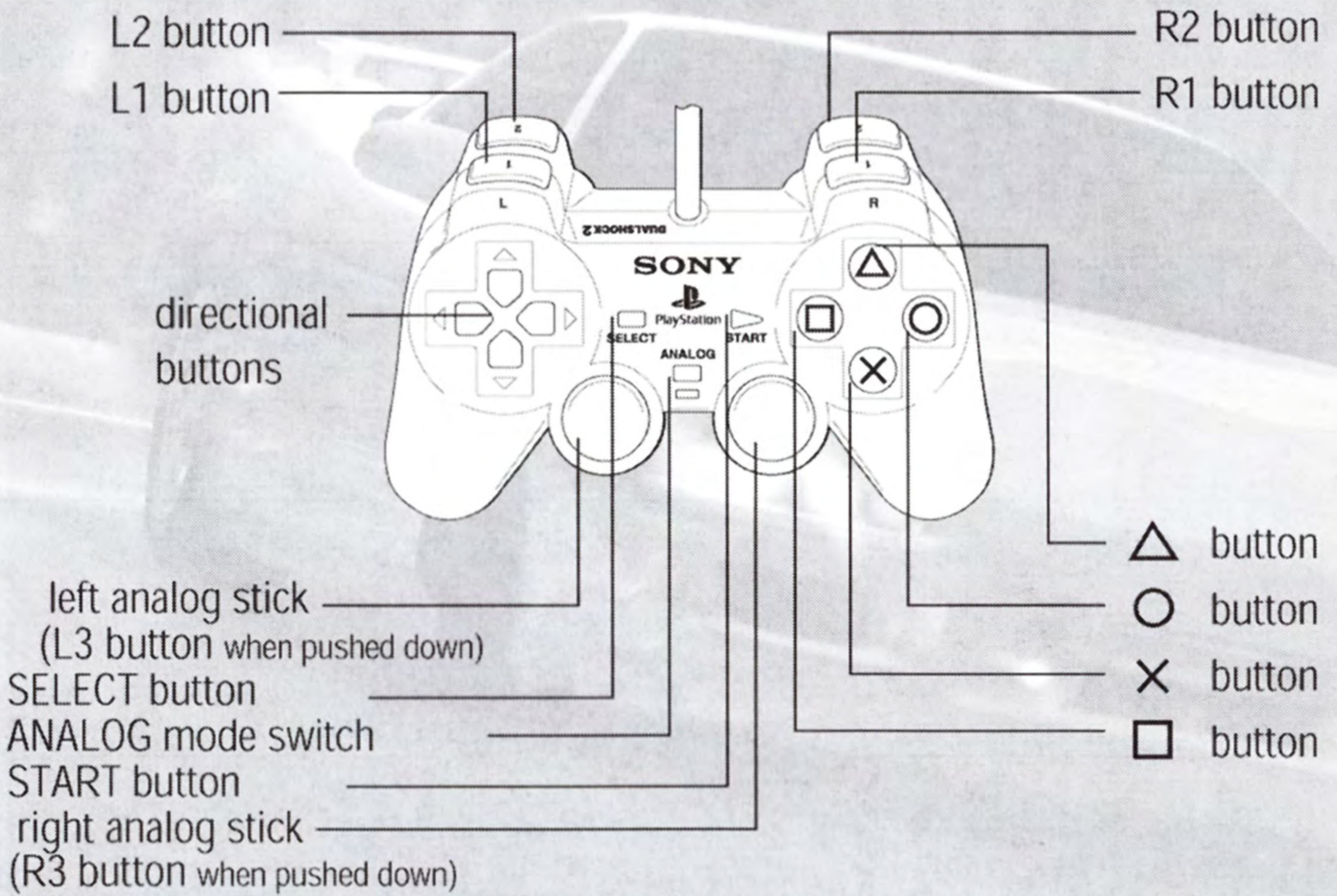


Set up your PlayStation®2 computer entertainment system according to the instructions in its Instruction Manual. Make sure the MAIN POWER switch (located on the back of the console) is turned on. Press the RESET button. When the power indicator lights up, press the open button and the disc tray will open. Place the (Tokyo Xtreme Racer Zero) disc on the disc tray with the label side facing up. Press the open button again and the disc tray will close. Attach game controllers and other peripherals, as appropriate. Follow on-screen instructions and refer to this manual for information on using the software.

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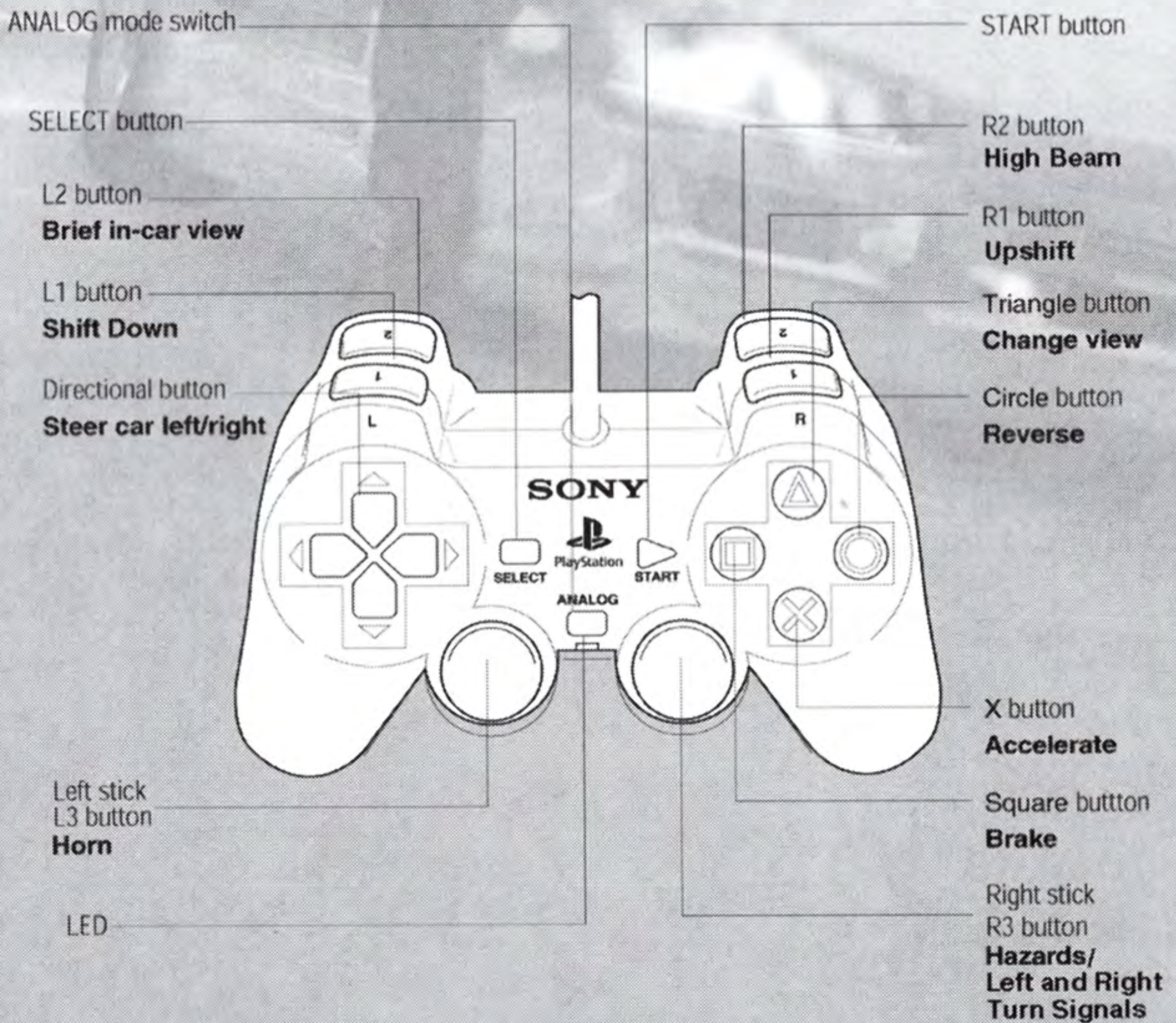
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GAME CONTROLS

STARTING A GAME

New Game: After buying a car you are taken to the "Garage". This is the main menu in Quest mode.

Load Game: After selecting Quest at the main menu, select "Continue" to load your previously saved game.

GAME CONTROLS - This game mode is for one player. Make sure to connect the **Dualshock™2 analog controller** and other peripherals before turning on your **PlayStation®2** computer entertainment system.

NEW GAME:

Buying a Car

You can choose between Class A, Class B, and Class C. When a New game is started, you begin with enough money to buy a Class A, Class B, or Class C car. While browsing the different cars, you can press the L1 or R1 buttons to bring up the car statistics. By pressing Up or Down on the directional buttons, you can change the color of the car. Additionally, pressing the square button will bring up the sort menu.

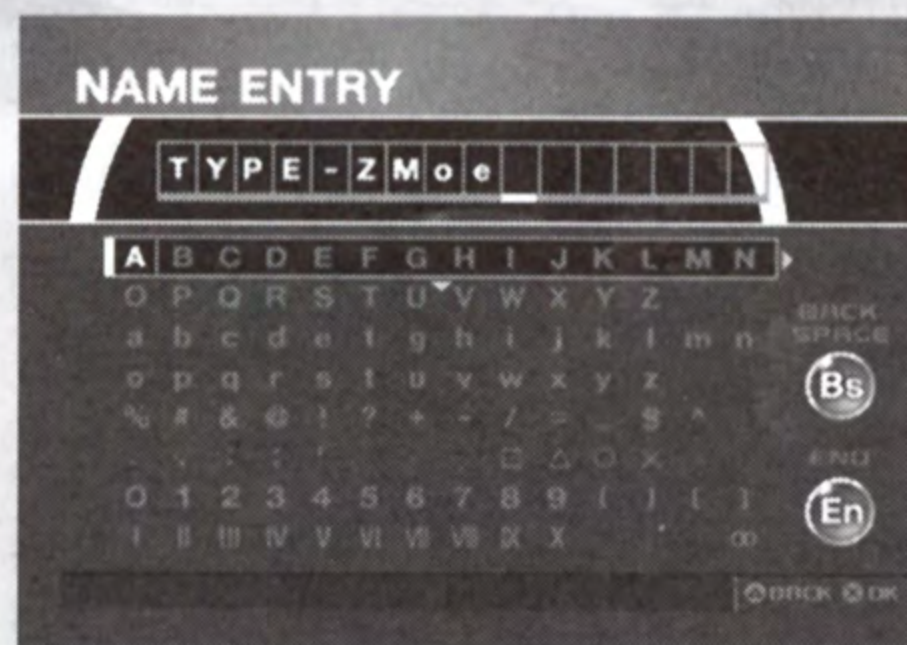
In this menu you can sort the cars by Car Name, Price, Power/Weight Ratio, or Torque/Weight Ratio. When buying a car, the drive-train, weight, horsepower and engine size appears in the upper right corner of the car display.



NOTE: Not all cars have the same choice of colors. However you can adjust the color to your liking using the Color Change feature described on page 12.

Name Entry

Use the directional buttons to move the cursor over the letter/number you want and press X to select it. Press the square button to delete letters.

License Plate

Press the Start button to complete your selection.



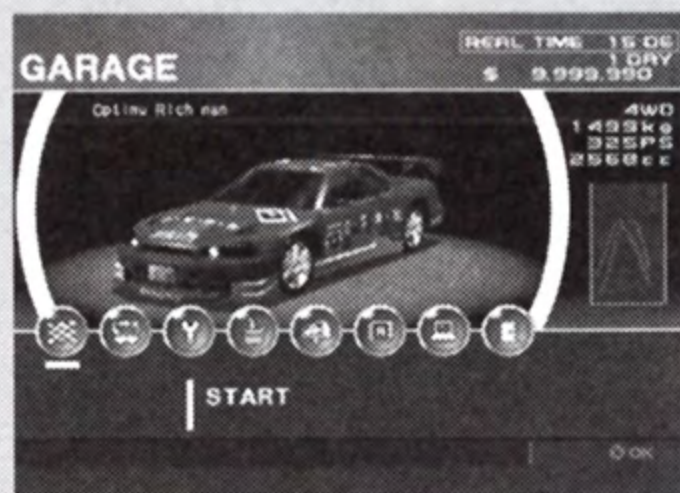
There are 8 selections in your Garage:


Start - Starts race.

Car Change - Change to another car (NOTE: You must have purchased more than 1 car).

Setting - Allows you to make adjustments to your car.

Parts Shop - Lets you buy, install and replace parts for your car.





Car Shop - Buy and Sell cars.

Rivals - Displays information on the rivals you have encountered so far.

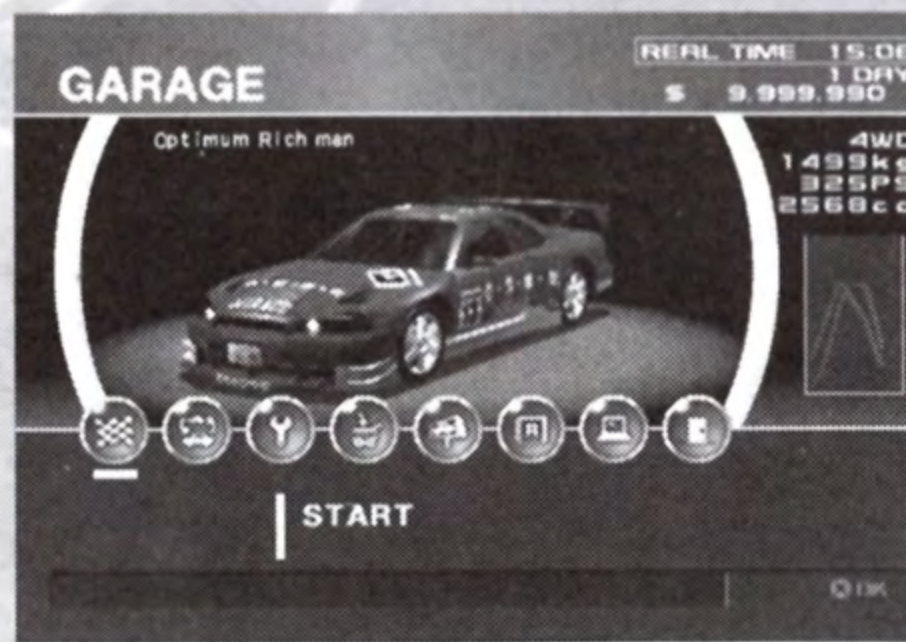
System - Allows you to save, load, and access options.

End Quest - Ends Quest mode.

In addition to these selections, there is other information you should know about in your Garage: You can press the L2 Button to activate a detailed specifications display about your current car, and you can press the R2 Button to display a User Information display. The User Information display shows how many races you've won, lost, drawn, your win average, max speed, speed rate (average speed), total mileage on your current car and how many cars you have stored in your Garage. Also in the Garage is "Real Time" located in the upper right corner above the number of days you've raced. This time is based on the time setting of the internal clock on your **PlayStation®2** computer entertainment system. This time is crucial in racing some of the later rivals.

Car Spec: On the right of the screen you'll see a small information panel that shows your current cars' drive-train, weight, horsepower, and engine size. Underneath this display you'll see the power graph. This graph shows the torque and horsepower rate of your current car.

Battle Name:



Your battle name is located in the upper left corner of your car display and changes as you progress through the game. It's what the other drivers call you based on your driving style.

Money - You gain money as you defeat rivals. You can use money to buy parts for your car, or buy a new car. The amount of money you have appears in the upper right corner of the Garage screen under the time and number of days you've raced.

HEADS UP DISPLAY

Starting a race in Quest mode

From the Garage, select the START button. Next you can choose where on the course you'd like to start, and in which direction. Make your choice, then select either Shift Assist ON, or OFF. Selecting ON will cause the car to shift automatically. Selecting OFF will require you to shift using the L1 Button and R1 Button on the controller. (Based on the Default control scheme)

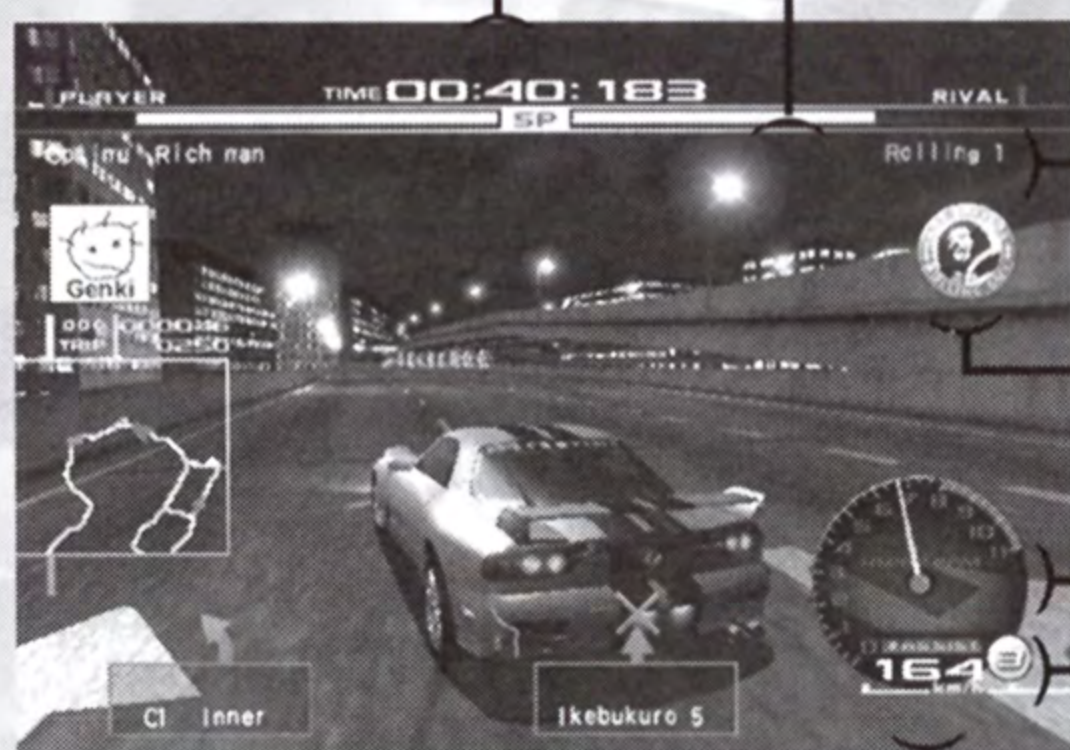

New rivals are Blue arrows, defeated rivals are green, the rival you are currently racing is red, and rivals that have defeated you or received a "Draw" are purple.

The Course:

When you start a Quest, only the first section of the course is available to you. Can you figure out how to unlock the rest of the course?

NOTE: You must unlock the other parts of the course in Quest mode to select them in the other modes of the game.

PAUSE OPTIONS

Pausing while driving

To pause the game, press the START Button. A Pause screen will appear with the following options:

- **Continue:** Resume game play.
- **Sound Volume:** Adjusts the music volume.
- **S.E. Volume:** Adjusts the sound effects volume.
- **Road Map:** Adjust the size of the Course Map or turn it off.
- **Course Guide:** Turn the Guide arrows On or Off.
- **Return to Garage:** Leave the Highway and return to your Garage.
- **Retire:** Leave a race in progress (**NOTE:** This will result in a lost race for you).

There are 3 pages to the Pause menu. Page one displays the options described above. By hitting the R1 Button you can move to page 2 which allows you to adjust the following aspects of your car:

- **Brake Balance**
- **Spring Rate - Front and Rear**
- **Damper - Front and Rear**
- **Ride Height - Front and Rear**
- **Turbo Boost**

By pressing the R1 Button again, you can go to page 3 which allows you to adjust your Gear Ratios. You can toggle back through the menu pages by pressing the L1 button.

CAR SETTINGS

Setting

In the Setting menu, you can adjust many aspects of your car for better performance. Move the sliders left or right using the directional buttons to make adjustments. Use the L1 and R1 buttons to skip settings, and use the L2 and R2 buttons to move the slider of a particular setting to the lowest setting, or the highest setting. Some settings will not be available to you until you upgrade certain parts of your car.

RESPONSE:

- Handle: This will adjust your steering response.
- Accel: For slow or fast acceleration.
- Brake: For slow or quick brake response.

BRAKE BALANCE: Apply more brake pressure to the front or rear of the car when the brakes are used.

RIDE HEIGHT: Adjust the height of the car.

GEAR RATIO: Adjust the gear ratios of your car for better acceleration or top speed.

SPRING RATE: Adjust the stiffness of the springs.

DAMPER: Adjust the stiffness of the shocks.

TURBO BOOST: Adjust the boost level.

(Low for top speed, high for acceleration)

PARTS SHOP

Parts Shop

In the Parts Shop you can upgrade different parts for your car. From engines and mufflers to headlights and horns.

Power Up Tune: Increase the horsepower of your car by upgrading the engine and muffler.

Drive Train Tune: Increase your engines' performance and overall stability of the car by upgrading your transmission, clutch and differential, suspension, as well as the brakes, tires and wheels.

Body Tune: Add stability to your car by upgrading roll cages.

Aero Tune: Add various cosmetic parts to your car to lighten it and improve down force at high speeds.

Dress Up Tune: Change the grill, headlights, and horn on your car.

Color Change: Paint your car.

Sticker: Purchase a sticker from the sticker gallery to place on your car.

Car Shop

The Car Shop lets you buy new cars as well as sell old ones. To sell a car, you must have already purchased a new one. The new car classes appear on the left side of the screen, while the sell car classes appear on the right. Buying a new car is just like buying a car for a new game.

Rivals

In the Rivals database, you can view all of the rivals you've defeated in Quest mode, along with brief descriptions of each of them. By pressing the L2 or R2 button you can view the car's color attributes. By pressing the square button, you can change the description. By pressing the circle button, you can race the rival you are viewing against your current car.

QUICK RACE

QUICK RACE

Defeat 100 rivals without regaining your SP!

In Quick Race, the rivals will all challenge you one after the other. When in Quick Race mode, your SP does not regenerate for each race.

On the "Base" screen (similar to the Garage), you have 6 options to choose from:

- **Start:** Takes you to the course selection screen, then into the Quick Race Mode.
- **Car Change:** Lets you select from any of the Demo cars, or from the cars you have saved in your Garage.
- **Setting:** Lets you adjust the settings of the car you're currently using.
- **Parts change:** Lets you select between parts that you have already purchased for your car.
- **System:** Takes you to the Save/Load/Options screen.
- **End Quick Race:** Exits out of Quick Race mode and returns you to the Mode Select screen.

Demo Car:

Once you select a car, you can select the Aero style you want. The number of styles vary for different cars.

TIME ATTACK

TIME ATTACK



Drive as fast as you can in various stages of the course. After selecting Time Attack from the Mode Select screen, you are taken to the "Base" screen (similar to the Garage), where you have 6 options to choose from:

- **Start:** Takes you to the course selection screen, then into the Time Attack mode.
- **Car Change:** Lets you select from any of the Demo cars, or from the cars you have saved in your Garage.
- **Setting:** Lets you adjust the settings of the car you're currently using.
- **Parts change:** Lets you select between parts that you have already purchased for your car.
- **System:** Takes you to the Save/Load/Options screen.
- **End Time Attack:** Exits out of Time Attack mode and returns you to the Mode Select screen.

(Once at the course selection screen, if you keep pressing to the right, you can highlight all of the courses you have unlocked, as well as an oval track.)

Demo Car:

Once you select a car, you can select the Aero style you want. The number of styles vary for different cars.

FREE RUN

FREE RUN:

Drive freely around Tokyo's Highways.

After selecting Free Run from the Mode Select screen, you are taken to the "Base" screen (similar to the Garage), where you have 6 options:

- **Start:** Takes you to the course selection screen, then onto the highway.
- **Car Change:** Lets you select from any of the Demo cars, or from the cars you have saved in your Garage.
- **Setting:** Lets you adjust the settings of the car you're currently using.
- **Parts change:** Lets you select between parts that you have already purchased for your car.
- **System:** Takes you to the Save/Load/Options screen.
- **End Free Run:** Exits out of Free Run mode and returns you to the Mode Select screen.

Demo Car:

Once you select a car, you can select the Aero style you want. The number of styles vary for different cars.

(**NOTE:** It is highly recommended you drive in this mode before starting a Quest to better familiarize yourself with the course.)

VERSUS



Versus Mode:

Allows you to race against a friend in a split screen, in-car view. When you select versus from the Mode Select screen, you may load a previously saved game from your memory card. Player 1 loads their game first, then Player 2 can load their game. (**NOTE:** Player 1 always makes their selections first in VS. mode) If you do not have a previously saved game to load, you are taken directly to the Class Select screen where you can choose from any of the Demo Cars. Once both players have selected their cars, Player 1 can select where on the course to race. After Player 1 has chosen a location to start, both players are given the option to turn Shift Assist ON or OFF. After both players have chosen their shifting preferences, the race will begin. (**NOTE:** Player 1's car always appears at the top of the screen, and Player 2's car always appears at the bottom of the screen. Also, in versus mode, the guide arrows do not appear when a fork is approached.)

Demo Car:

Once you select a car, you can select the Aero style you want. The number of styles vary for different cars.

SYSTEM

Pausing in VS. mode

Either player can press the Start Button to pause the game. On the Pause menu, only the player that paused the game may make selections. The selections are as follows:

- **Continue:** Returns to the race.
- **Sound Volume:** Adjusts the Music volume.
- **S.E. Volume:** Adjusts the sound effects volume.
- **Retire:** Quits the race. (NOTE: The player that chooses "Retire" loses the race).

SYSTEM

In the System, you have 7 options:

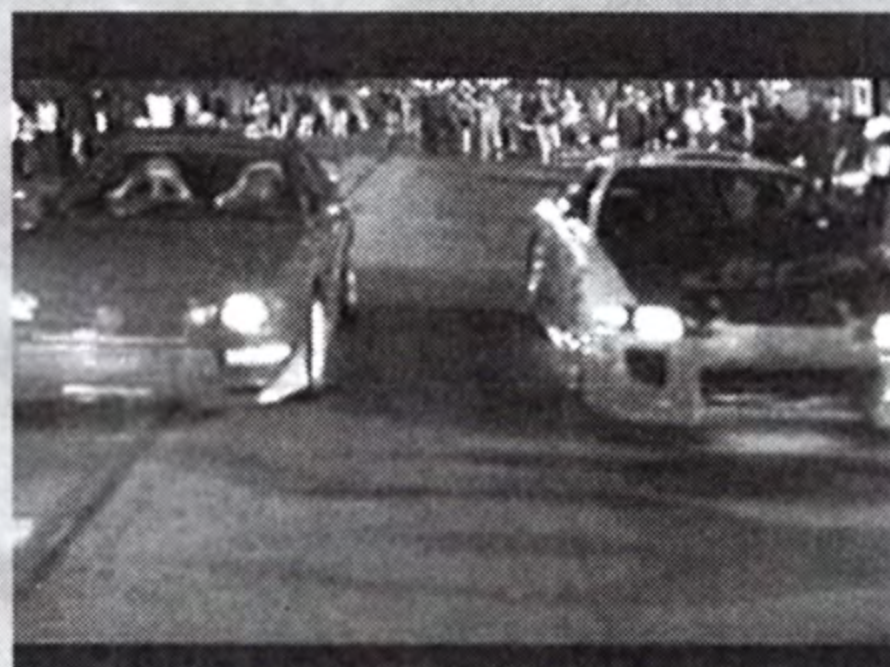
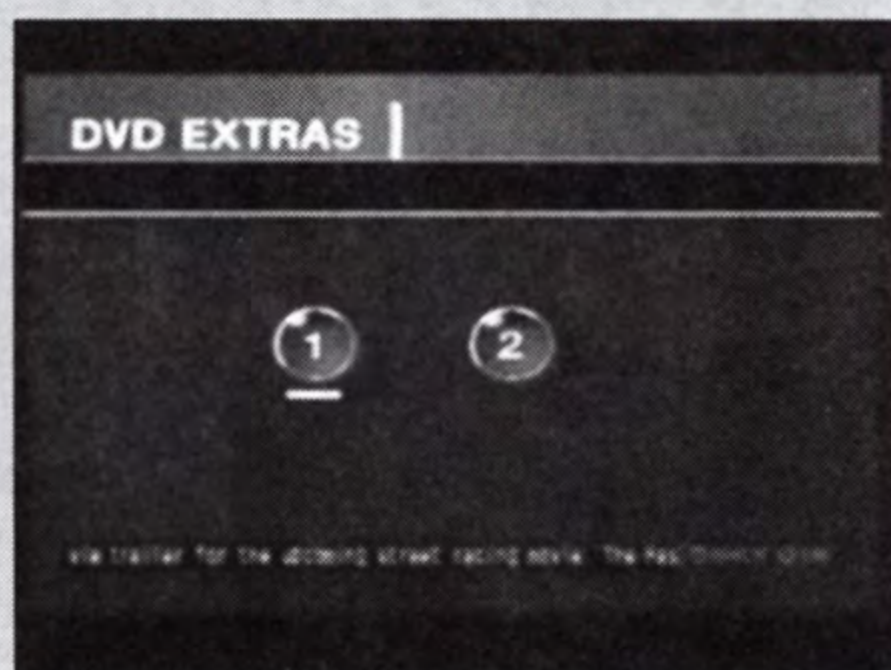
- **Game Config:** Adjust game options.
 - **View:** Select the default view when driving:
Driver's, Behind, Chaser's, Bird
 - **SP Battle:** Select either Real or Normal mode.
Real = SP reduction when your car hits objects.
Normal = No reduction taken when your car hits objects.
 - **Road Map:** Select between Wide, Normal, and OFF.
 - **Course Guide:** Turn the Course Guide ON or OFF.
The Course Guide is the display that appears at the bottom of your screen when you approach a fork in the highway (directional arrows telling you which way you can go).

- **Vibration:** Turn the Dual Shock vibration in the game ON or OFF.
 - **Sound Config:** Listen to music from the game and set the background music for various sections of the game.
 - **Output:** Select either Stereo or Mono.
 - **Music Box:** Listen to any of the 30 music tracks in the game.
 - **Free Run BGM:** Set the background music in the Free Run mode. You can select 4 tracks that will loop while you drive.
 - **Battle BGM:** Set the background music for when you are driving in Quest mode. You can select 3 tracks.
 - **Replay BGM:** Set the background music for when you are viewing a Replay. You can select 2 tracks.
 - **BGM Volume:** Set the music volume.
 - **SE Volume:** Set the Sound Effects volume.
 - **Key Config:** Select from 7 different controller configurations for player 1 or player 2.
 - **Time Attack Record:** Displays your best Time Attack records for each section of the course.
 - **Load Replay:** Loads a previously saved Replay from your memory card.
 - **Load Game File:** Loads a previously saved game from your memory card.
 - **Save Game File:** Saves your current game file and system configurations.

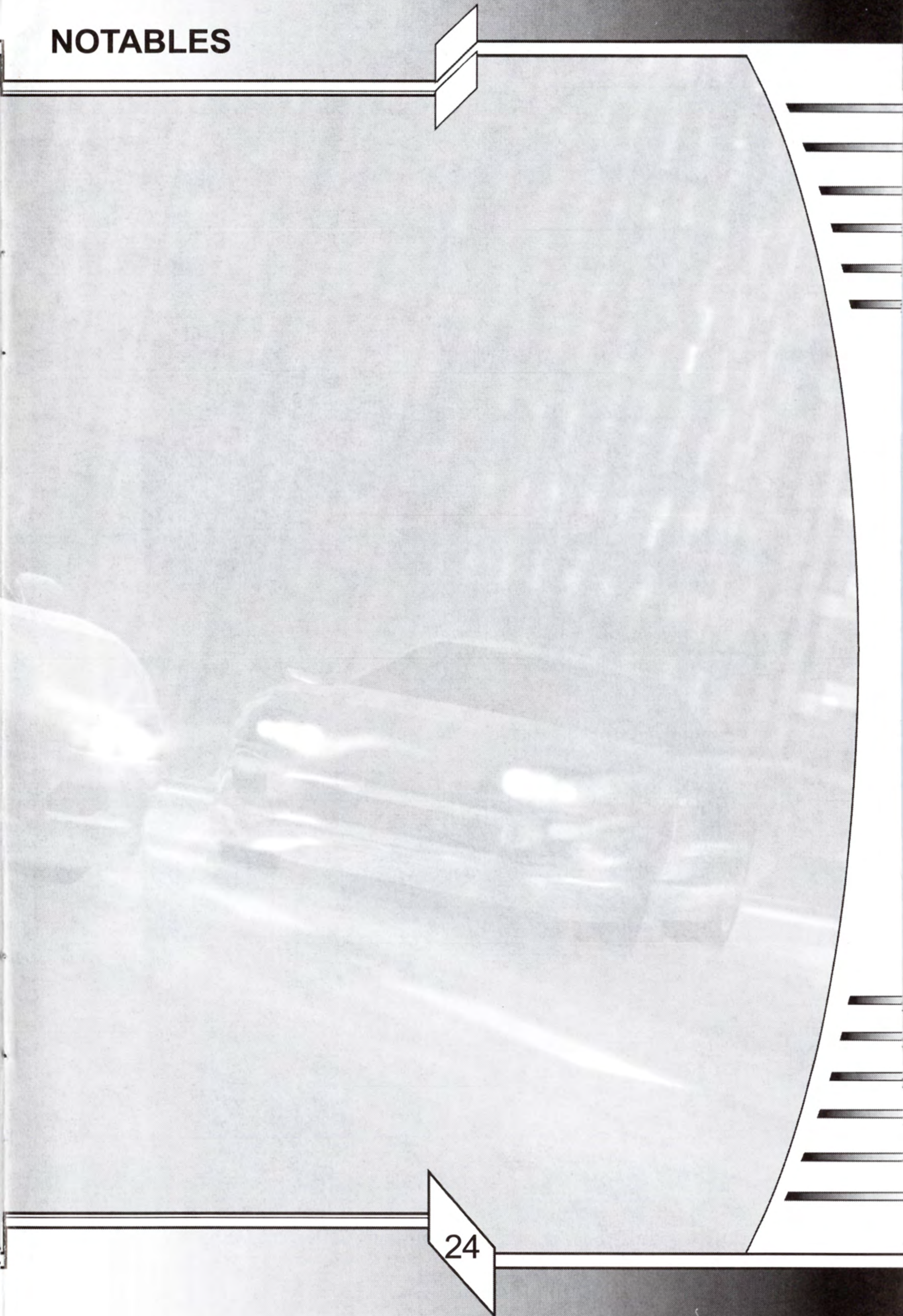
